S/C FARER: Anne FARER, 33316.

D/Sgt FLYNN: [REDACTED] do you agree the time is now 4.14pm?

G. [REDACTED] Yes I do.

Q.1 What is your full name and address?

( G. [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

Q.2 [REDACTED] I intend to interview you in relation to the offence of trafficking by way of manufacturing a drug of dependence and possessing articles, equipment etc to manufacture a drug of dependence. Before continuing I must inform you that you are not obliged to say or do anything but anything you say or do may be given in evidence. Do you understand this?

G. [REDACTED] Yes I do.

Q.3 I must also inform you of the following rights. You may communicate with or attempt to communicate with a friend or relative to inform that person of your whereabouts. You may communicate with or attempt to communicate with a legal practitioner. If you are not a citizen or permanent resident of Australia, you may communicate with or attempt to communicate with a consular office of the country for which you are a citizen. Do you understand these rights?

G. [REDACTED] Yes. I do.

Q.4 Do you wish to exercise any of these rights before the interview proceeds?

( A. I couldn't tell you who he was. It was someone, a body guard or someone ...

Q.429 All right, is there anything else at the premises, other chemicals that have been supplied by other persons and people we've spoken about?

A. You know, nothing out of the ordinary. Acetones I got myself. And that's basically it.

Q.430 And earlier you mentioned, you said something to me about um, um firearms?

A. Yes ah, in the event of, at one stage I was really being um, with the [REDACTED] incident, from [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

Q.431 Yeah.

A. I was ah, I was ah in fear for my life from the um [REDACTED] of [REDACTED]

Q.432 Yeah.

A. Because apparently all the gear that he bought off me, he bought of me has gone to them, and he used to cut it so badly that they wanted to know where he got it from and who to to ah, to take care of for giving him such an inferior quality or whatever, they wanted their money back.

Q.433 Yeah.

A. And he passed them on to me. Which I was then confronted by a [REDACTED] who threatened to kill me. So I shat myself and I went to um, went to [REDACTED] for help and the only thing [REDACTED] could turn around and tell me well, you know, you deserve it. For going elsewhere and not giving it to me. I thought this is how you look after me you prick. In not so many words but you know, that was how I felt.

Yeah.

A. So, the threat was very real, a few [REDACTED] come, you know, in my driveway and all sorts of stuff and I went and seen a friend of mine um, by the name of ....., I don't know if you know him or not.

*It doesn't ring a bell no.*

A. And one of the guys from the ... and he them um, I asked if he could get some, you know, if there's anything around, a firearm around. And ah he said yeah there's quite a few, there's a fcw. There's two that he knew of. And ah he presented himself with these firearms and I made sure to ask, they hadn't been used in any incident that I should know about that made them dirty, I don't want to be implicated in any murders or anything like that. Um, but by the look of them they had never been, you know, if they'd been fired, well how could you really tell but they, they looked very very clean, very very new.

- Q.436                   Okay. So when did you get those?
- A.                       I got those about ah, around the incident would have been about [REDACTED] time.
- Q.437                   Okay. And how much did you pay for those?
- A.                       I paid [REDACTED] thousand a piece.
- Q.438                   So [REDACTED] thousand dollars?
- A.                       Yeah.
- Q.439                   And they're stored somewhere inside [REDACTED] now?
- A.                       Yes. What happened was is that um, when the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] thing went down
- Q.440                   Yeah.
- A.                       I had them at home
- Q.441                   Yeah.
- A.                       For security reasons, at home. Then ah, what happened was, I had them ah ah stored in my bedroom
- Q.442                   Yeah

A. I had one under the bed, under the mattress

Q.443 Yeah.

A. And I went into my room to see my kids jumping on the bed

Q.444 Yeah.

A. Um, I shit myself.

Q.445 I can understand that.

A. And I put them in the trailer.

Q.446 All right I think that's just about it at this stage. Any further questions?
