they're not ... that's exactly what I know, what I've

heard. Right. I got nothing to fucking hide"

O'BRIEN: "All right, well, it's up to you, you can either keep

your solicitor or it's up to you whether you get another

solicitor."

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BATESON: "You make the assessment yourself

"Jim's good."

BATESON: "Jim is good. Jim's a good solicitor."

"Jim's fair. Jim's been telling me"

BATESON: "I'll tell you one thing – I truly believe Jim's a good

solicitor, I believe he's an honest solicitor."

"Yeah, he is."

BATESON: "But you are putting him between a rock and a hard

place. You are putting him where he's in a potential conflict of interest. That's something for you and him

to work out."

"I can tell Jim, okay I'll tell you what's gunna happen,

I'll speak to and I'll roll. Okay?"

BATESON: "Okay. Well you let us know. We'll start the ball

rolling when you let us know. But we won't be

coming down again."

"This is the offer."

"Yeah. Nine out of ten, I'm gunna take it because I'm not gunna do years for nothing. I'll just say it as it is." "That's all we ask mate. From the start and the truth." BATESON: "I can tell you I'll give you the truth but if it conflicts Im not trying to fuck because if it does, I'm just gunna say it as it is and if it just doesn't interest me well just to fuck him over, I just want to say it and that's it. But I will tell you something. I can tell you that now, now you can take it anyway you want, did, wherever he was and I can bring it all up, cos I started working things out, I went to go and see Willy, then I had Andrew come and see me, he said back off or I'll put a bullet in your head, right, it was easy, it wasn't hard but it was easy for me to work out what was going down, after it happened I knew exactly who fucking everything. The reason why I can't understand why was there, had a blew and they never got along, that's besides the point, but I'll tell you the whole story then yous'll have to assess it yourselves." **BATESON:** "Yeah, that's all we ask mate, that's all we ask." "Got to sort out "All right. Well do you want us to speak to PIII or O'BRIEN: not?" "Can you talk to PII for me?" "I can talk to PII." **BATESON:** "All you do is ring PII up and say I've told you to come and see PII **BATESON:** "Yeah."

"Say look I want to say the truth, just lay it out."

BATESON: "The truth is that you're going to be involving

yourself in a whole lot more than what you've been

charged with, right?"

"I'm gunna tell youse mate."

BATESON: "Yeah."

"Whatever I know, I'll just tell it straight, whatever

you know, I just, fuck I'm over it."

BATESON: "All right well I'll go see no worries."

: "Go and see PII and I'll ring up Jim to come and see

me this week. Jim's all right. I was gunna say Jim, don't get me wrong, but I'm gunna go explain."

BATESON: "Yep."

"And Jim'll be wrapped. Jim told me to go this way."

BATESON: "Yeah, as I said I reckon Jim"

"Jim knows the whole story between both cases,

BATESON: "Yeah, I've known Jim for a lot of years and I've

always found him very good to deal with."

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BATESON: "What's that?"

"Youse did a good job, youse did. It was stupidity.

BATESON: "It won't be today. It'll probably be tomorrow evening." "Yeah, just ring up and say look don't stress, told me to come and see you." **BATESON:** "Okay." I think she relaxed when she was in that "Get last time." liked her. Right. No worries." **BATESON:** "Don't lie to me, you reckon I'm a cunt so what's the difference." **BATESON:** "Reckon you are?" "Yeah." O'BRIEN: "Well they're wrong because we don't have any opinions one way or the other. We get paid to do a job and we do that job "Yeah, it's a low act when there's involved." O'BRIEN: "Of course." **BATESON:** "We're just doing our job mate. You asked me how could I sit across the table from and listen to him.I'm just doing my job." O'BRIEN: "End of the day, we only want the truth, what happened and that's it. It's not a matter of taking sides with people." "All right mate. We'll knock on the door and we'll **BATESON:** go." "All right. And once I speak to Saturday and Jim, Jim I'll get him out here before

the weekend ... And Jim'll keep it between us

anyway."

O'BRIEN: "All right."

"Jimmy'll keep that there and I just want to let him

know if I'm shifting."

BATESON: "Yeah-no that's all right."

"Yeah. All right."

BATESON: "All right."

O'BRIEN: "All right. Thanks

"Sorry for all the heartaches. I should have told you

from the start."

BATESON: "Should have told us from the start."

"Hey?"

BATESON: "I told you that from the start."

"But when you've got to worry about it's not

easy."

BATESON: "Yeah."

"When you've got you've got to be careful."

BATESON: "Yeah."

"With the cop, don't stress."

O'BRIEN: "No, I just think it's a risk, it's a risk thing. Just think

of it as a risk."

"It is, that's why I'm worried."

O'BRIEN: "It's a risk to you."

"I've always been worried about that haven't I Mr.

BATESON?"

BATESON: "Well you have, yeah."

"You can't understand how this, you know."

O'BRIEN: "Fair enough."

BATESON: "Give them another knock mate."

BATESON: "All right well next week sometime we'll get down."
