My full name is Mr Bickley My full details are known to police.

I make this statement in the belief that anything contained in it cannot be used against me in any criminal proceeding.

I have made 3 previous statements to police relating to my involvement in the manufacture of ecstasy. I wish to make the following addition to these statements.

In some time during 2005, I think it was early 2005 Tony MOKBEL was dropped off around the corner from my factory by someone driving a red Honda Civic. This is the same red Honda Civic I have mentioned in my earlier statement.

Tony came into the factory and told me that he had a mate coming to pick up some chemicals and also told me that his mate would drop off some chemicals that he wanted destroyed. He told me he would give me a bit of extra cash to get rid of these chemicals. I knew at this time that the chemicals Tony referred to was waste product.

A couple of minutes later a male in a white ute with a silver tray, I think it may have been a Holden Rodeo came to the factory. The male driving the ute was an older male, probably in his mid – late 40's. He was wearing an Akubra type hat. I remember that he had a slouched posture and he was wearing a flannelette shirt, with boots and pants. I noticed that the male had a number of drums on the back of his ute that he had covered with a tarp and tied down.

Tony introduced me to him however I cannot remember his name. I referred to him as the farmer because of how he was dressed. Tony told me to give

the male the chemicals and for him to leave the chemicals he had bought with me.

The chemicals I was to give him were acetone, caustic soda, methanol, methylated spirits and glacial acetic acid. I remember that they took a little bit of everything because they were experimenting at that time. I say this because Tony later complained that the chemicals I had provided were not of high enough quality.

The male, and myself helped the male unload his ute, and load the additional chemicals on top. The chemicals I had supplied the male were covered with the tarp and tied down.

After the male in the ute left, and I took the chemicals which we had stacked on a pallet into the back of the factory. The then emptied the chemicals into the toilet. I remember that the chemicals stunk very badly of solvent or acid. It was very potent. Then threw the containers into the dump master bins we had at the factory.

A couple of months later Eddie mentioned to me that the farmer was going to drop off some more chemicals. The following day the farmer came in the same ute with 2, 200 (44 Gallon) litre drums on the back. One of the drums blue and had screw top and the other was black and had a lever top.

When he first arrived I was curious as to what was in the drums so I opened the black drum. As soon as I opened it my eyes started watering and it again smelt of solvents.

We used the forklift to unload it. I drove the forklift and helped the farmer to load the drums onto the pallet. I then drove the pallet containing the chemicals into the factory where they remained for about two months before again tipped it down the toilet. I remember seeing wearing a mask and gloves whilst he was doing this.

This was the last time 1 saw the farmer.


