You may refuse to undergo the procedure. If you refuse to undergo the procedure, and the procedure is defined as a compulsory procedure, a member of the police force may make application to a magistrate's court for an order authorising the conduct of the procedure, or a senior police officer may authorise a non-intimate compulsory procedure.
