Involvement or association with any investigations that had dealings with Ms Gobbo (Q2)

- 6. Save with the single exception I discuss below, to the best of my knowledge, I have not had any involvement or association with an investigation which had dealings with Ms Gobbo.
- 7. On 18 January 2006, I was tasked by Cruze-DSS of the Undercover Unit, with assessing Ms Gobbo in connection with a potential undercover operation as part of Operation Posse.¹
- 8. That was the first time I learnt that Ms Gobbo was a human source for Victoria Police.
- 9. On 2 February 2006, I met with Ms Gobbo and her handler, Peter Smith-O in North Melbourne. My police diary records that the meeting went from 7.45pm to 10.35pm.²
- 10. For the purpose of preparing my statement, I have been told that the meeting was recorded and I have been informed that a transcript of the recording was later generated. I have not reviewed that transcript, nor listened to the recording, but I have reviewed my diary for that period, insofar as it concerns Ms Gobbo.
- 11. The purpose of the meeting was to assess Ms Gobbo's motivation and suitability for an undercover operation, any safety issues which might arise and to discuss, Ms Gobbo's potential role in such an operation. At that time, it was contemplated that Ms Gobbo may be in a position one or more targets of Operation Posse at an being planned My diary records that Ms Gobbo expressed some concerns for her safety and expressed a concern that her actions may identify her as assisting police.
- 12. On 27 February 2006, I attended a meeting with members of the Source Development Unit and Cruze-DSS about the potential undercover operation. My diary records that Sandy White-O Detective Senior Sergeant O'Brien, Green-O and Cruze-DSS were in attendance. Following discussion, the outcome of the meeting was that the Undercover Unit was not going to proceed with the proposed undercover operation. I cannot now recall why the operation did not proceed, although my diary makes reference to health issues and a pending trial.
- 13. As I only had a single meeting with Ms Gobbo, I infer that the proposed undercover operation was in its preliminary stages when it was decided it would not proceed. To the best of my knowledge, that was the only time Ms Gobbo had any association with the Undercover Unit.

14. I am not aware of any other investigation on which I worked having any connection with Ms Gobbo. I believe I would have been aware, if that were the case.

How I learned, or were given reason to believe, Ms Gobbo was providing information to police (Q3)

15. I first learnt that Ms Gobbo was providing information to police on 18 January 2006, as I explain in paragraphs 7 and 8 above.

Awareness of others (Q4)

16. Save for the persons in attendance at the 27 February 2006 meeting to which I refer in paragraph 12, and Peter Smith-O I am not aware of any other members of Victoria Police, or other organisations, who were aware that Ms Gobbo was providing information or assistance to police.

Authorisation of the use of Ms Gobbo as a human source (Q5)

17. I do not know who was involved in the authorisation or continued authorisation of Ms Gobbo as a human source.

Personal contact with Ms Gobbo (Q6)

18. As I explain in paragraph 9, I met Ms Gobbo in person on 2 February 2006. To the best of my knowledge, that meeting was the extent of our personal contact.

Information & assistance received (Q7 & Q8)

19. Save in respect of Ms Gobbo's potential assistance with the undercover operation which did not proceed, and whatever information Ms Gobbo provided to me and her handler during our meeting on 2 February 2006, I am not aware of any information provided or assistance given by Ms Gobbo to Victoria Police. I did not act upon any information Ms Gobbo provided to me.

Concerns raised as to the use of a legal practitioner as a human source (Q9)

20. I have no knowledge of these matters.

Concerns raised as to the use of Ms Gobbo as a human source (Q10)

21. I have no knowledge of these matters.

Awareness about disclosure in relation to Ms Gobbo (Q11)

22. I have no knowledge of these matters.
