Thank-you Paul.

I spoke with Margaret today.

She will most likely brief Howard Mason and is aware of the conflict issues that would arise with Nicola Gobbo.

She didn't demand a meeting with the DPP. I offered to put our view in writing and she said that they had to confirm funding first. (!)

Mr Bickley obviously wants to avoid gaol. I reiterated that this would not be possible, that the DPP was very firm in his view as to immediate custody, but that we would concede obviously that he is entitled to a significant discount due to his assistance and that some parity would apply the second sec

I confirmed that the benefits of going ahead as a plea would be the lesser dates on the presentment and that his latest would not proceed. I told her that we had no discretion re the Confiscations Act & his properties.

I flagged the possibility of an indemnity for the wider period so he need not worry about that.

She told me that we be upset that either the statement (she wouldn't say who) was not truthful in his statement, and I responded that this was something they could address at the plea. She doesn't have a copy of we be statements - so can you provide them to her?
