

- (6) preparing a drug of dependence for the purpose of offering it for sale.
 - (7) preparing a drug of dependence for the purpose of selling it.
 - (8) preparing a drug of dependence for the purpose of exchanging it.
4. It is alleged that the accused and his [REDACTED] - [REDACTED] - operated a drug trafficking business.³

[REDACTED] to give evidence

5. [REDACTED] has previously faced court for her drug offences. She has pleaded “guilty” and has been dealt with. She will be called by the prosecution to give evidence.
6. [REDACTED]
- (1) met the accused in about [REDACTED] the accused also went by the name Harry Pham.
 - (2) [REDACTED] with the accused some months after they met.
 - (3) in 2005, [REDACTED] a house at [REDACTED] Coburg.
 - (4) she and the accused trafficked drugs. The accused had a number of phones. Customers would ring, meeting places were arranged, heroin was packaged in silver foil or in a balloon was exchanged for cash and on some occasions, goods would be accepted in payment.
 - (5) 3-5 drug transactions occurred daily.

Telephone intercepts

7. In November 2005, warrants were issued that authorised police to tap the phone number [REDACTED] for 60 days. The number was used by the accused and [REDACTED]
8. Relevant calls and text messages to and from that number were recorded by the police from 9/11/05 to 17/12/05. The calls will be played.
