

1 chronological order now a presentment against the
2 prisoner ^{Mr Cooper} , large commercial quantity, 13
3 February 2002.

4 HIS HONOUR: Yes.

5 MR HORGAN: Then you should have a presentment with four names
6 on it, Caliban Mokbel, ^{Mr Cooper} and [REDACTED],
7 large commercial quantity, those that Your Honour has
8 just mentioned in relation to [REDACTED].

9 HIS HONOUR: Only ^{Mr Cooper} needs to be arraigned
10 with regard to that. Yes.

11 MR HORGAN: That's right, and then you should have a third
12 presentment against ^{Mr Cooper} . possession of a drug
13 of dependence, 11 April 2003, then the final presentment,
14 the one I have just filed, is a three count presentment,
15 traffic a large commercial quantity, traffic a commercial
16 quantity and possess two unregistered category handguns.

17 HIS HONOUR: I certify that presentment has been filed.

18 MR HORGAN: Your Honour, my learned friend Mr Allen has said
19 that he just wants a minute or two to speak to his client
20 about a matter that we discussed a short time ago before
21 Your Honour came on the bench and he wants a few minutes
22 to do that, if that were convenient.

23 HIS HONOUR: There is a further presentment with each of the
24 presentments.

25 MR HORGAN: Yes, it's the same further presentment so we only
26 need to do it once.

27 HIS HONOUR: Only need to do it once. Do you have instructions
28 with regard to that at this stage Mr Allen?

29 MR ALLEN: Not specifically, Your Honour, I do generally
30 speaking, but if the matter could be briefly stood down I
31 will get those instructions and there is another matter I
