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## SITUATION

### Summary of Investigation/Background

1. This Operation is the fourth (4) and fifth (5) phases of Operation [REDACTED] conducted by the Purana Task Force. It is anticipated that further phases may be initiated following this phase and dependent upon the execution results.

11. Between [REDACTED] 2002 and [REDACTED] 2003 investigators from the [REDACTED] investigated [REDACTED] in relation to the [REDACTED]. In February 2003 investigators discovered he had set up a [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] as a [REDACTED]. 12. On [REDACTED] 2003 [REDACTED] was arrested shortly after [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] was charged with [REDACTED] and related offences.

13. Between 21 September 2005 and 26 September 2005, a registered human source 21803838 (hereinafter referred to as RHS) provided information that members of the [REDACTED] family are involved in the [REDACTED] and that they have numerous people working for them including [REDACTED]

14. On 4 October 2005 an anonymous telephone call was received by police that [REDACTED] who lives somewhere in [REDACTED] is [REDACTED] for [REDACTED]. Caller states [REDACTED] is still [REDACTED] and is driving a dark coloured [REDACTED]

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15. On 25 November 2005 surveillance conducted by the State Surveillance Unit revealed [REDACTED] exiting [REDACTED] and entering vehicle [REDACTED]. He then drove to [REDACTED] where he checked the letter box for mail prior to entering the premises. Later that day he attended at the [REDACTED] Shopping Centre where he met with [REDACTED].

16. Records held by Vic Roads reveal that motor vehicle [REDACTED] is a [REDACTED] registered in the name of [REDACTED] of [REDACTED].

17. On 4 December 2005 surveillance conducted by the Surveillance Unit in the [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] areas revealed that [REDACTED] attended the [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] in motor vehicle registration number [REDACTED] and met with [REDACTED] and an unknown male. [REDACTED] drove motor vehicle registration number [REDACTED] to the meeting.

18. On 9 December 2005 RHS stated [REDACTED] had recently come into possession of [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] and that the [REDACTED] was going to be used for the [REDACTED]. The RHS further stated that [REDACTED] had assisted in organising a [REDACTED] and would [REDACTED] from the sale of the [REDACTED].

19. Enquiries with Forensic Chemist Michael PERKAL of the Victoria Police Forensic Services Centre revealed that [REDACTED] is capable of [REDACTED] between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] is a [REDACTED] for the [REDACTED] of [REDACTED].

20. On 26 December 2005 RHS stated [REDACTED] is [REDACTED] this week and is [REDACTED] a male referred to as [REDACTED] how to [REDACTED]. RHS further stated that [REDACTED] will be [REDACTED] over the new year period.

25. On 28 December 2005 surveillance conducted by the Surveillance Unit revealed [REDACTED] drove [REDACTED] in vehicle [REDACTED] to the [REDACTED] to report on bail.

26. On 30 December 2005, surveillance conducted by the Surveillance Unit revealed that [REDACTED] exited [REDACTED] and got into vehicle [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] later returned to the above address got into motor vehicle [REDACTED] then attended at the [REDACTED] Shopping Centre [REDACTED] where he met with [REDACTED]. Upon leaving [REDACTED] was carrying a white bag.

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27. On 12 January 2006 RHS stated that [REDACTED] is an associate of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and is assisting [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] gained from [REDACTED]

28. Between 29 December 2005 and 19 January 2006 RHS stated that [REDACTED] was about to [REDACTED] on either [REDACTED] 2005 or [REDACTED] 2005 and that the [REDACTED] was located in the [REDACTED]

29. Between 4 January 2006 and 22 January 2006 monitoring of telecommunications service [REDACTED] pursuant to Telephone Intercept warrant [REDACTED] revealed that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were gambling at the [REDACTED] on the [REDACTED] and that [REDACTED] had [REDACTED] in one night.

30. On 10 February 2006 RHS stated [REDACTED] and a male known as [REDACTED] are [REDACTED] together and that [REDACTED] has access to [REDACTED] and wants to turn it into [REDACTED] through the [REDACTED]

31. Investigators have identified [REDACTED] referred to in the previous paragraph as [REDACTED] is a close and trusted associate of [REDACTED] having previously [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] when [REDACTED] was on [REDACTED]. It is believed that [REDACTED] it [REDACTED] to be his [REDACTED]

32. On 11 February 2006 the State Surveillance Unit observed vehicle [REDACTED] outside the [REDACTED] address [REDACTED]

33. On 13 February 2006 RHS stated [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were about to [REDACTED] however had to wait for a supply of [REDACTED] prior to commencing the [REDACTED]. The RHS further stated that [REDACTED] had recently [REDACTED] in [REDACTED]

34. On 23 February 2006 RHS stated that [REDACTED] currently has [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] and is in a position to start [REDACTED]. The RHS further stated that he was going to [REDACTED] in the [REDACTED] as he did during the [REDACTED] period because he [REDACTED] at that [REDACTED]. The RHS further stated that [REDACTED] would be collected at the [REDACTED] address by an unknown male in an unknown motor vehicle and [REDACTED] the [REDACTED] of the unknown motor vehicle to the location where he is [REDACTED] to avoid police detection.

35. RHS also stated that [REDACTED] would be assisted in the [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] by [REDACTED] and that [REDACTED] supplied [REDACTED] with [REDACTED] of an unknown [REDACTED] used in the [REDACTED]

36. On 24 February 2006 telephone intercept warrant number [REDACTED] commenced for telephone mobile number [REDACTED] utilised by [REDACTED]

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37. On 27 February 2006 the State Surveillance Unit observed [REDACTED] driving vehicle [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] with a female passenger believed to be [REDACTED] girlfriend [REDACTED] (hereinafter referred to as [REDACTED]) attended at [REDACTED] where the female exited the vehicle. [REDACTED] then attended at [REDACTED] in the vehicle.

38. On 13 March 2006 RHS stated that on [REDACTED] 2006 at 10.00 pm [REDACTED] met with [REDACTED] (hereinafter referred to as [REDACTED]) in the McDonalds car park situated in [REDACTED]. A couple of hours later [REDACTED] again met with [REDACTED] in the McDonalds car park situated in [REDACTED] at which time he [REDACTED]

39. RHS further stated that [REDACTED] had [REDACTED] a [REDACTED] in the [REDACTED] area and was going to [REDACTED] on [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was going to [REDACTED] from the same [REDACTED] he has used in the past and has acquired an additional [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] from [REDACTED] since [REDACTED]. The RHS further stated that [REDACTED] had [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] one week [REDACTED] and was in the [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] how to [REDACTED] so there is [REDACTED] to continue whilst [REDACTED] is in [REDACTED]

40. RHS also stated that [REDACTED] was concerned that [REDACTED] will take over the [REDACTED] entirely and he will be left out of the process. He has taken [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] to assist him once [REDACTED] to [REDACTED]

41. On 17 March 2006 RHS stated [REDACTED] had [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] waiting to be [REDACTED]

42. On 30 March 2006 RHS stated that [REDACTED] was collected from [REDACTED] area by [REDACTED] who was driving vehicle [REDACTED] stated that he had been [REDACTED] and had [REDACTED] of the [REDACTED] only to [REDACTED] and have dinner. He further stated that he was going back to [REDACTED] and would be finished [REDACTED]. He also stated that he [REDACTED] near [REDACTED] and mentioned he had to [REDACTED] a [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] he [REDACTED] to the [REDACTED] he was utilizing. He stated that the [REDACTED] would be delivered to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

43. On 7 April 2006 surveillance conducted by the State Surveillance Unit observed [REDACTED] driving vehicle [REDACTED]. He was observed to park this vehicle in the drive of the [REDACTED] address and enter the premises.

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44. On 10 April 2006 investigators observed vehicle [REDACTED] in the car park of [REDACTED]. Surveillance on this vehicle then observed [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] walking towards and subsequently entering this vehicle.

45. On 10 April 2006 RHS stated that [REDACTED] had observed police presence in the [REDACTED] area and had parked his vehicle in the [REDACTED] car park to assist in identifying police surveillance. [REDACTED] further stated that he believed the police had him under surveillance because of [REDACTED] and that he believed the location of [REDACTED] was still secure.

46. On 11 April 2006 investigators received information from a RHS, via the [REDACTED] stating that an associate of the [REDACTED] family, [REDACTED] was in possession of [REDACTED] which was being stored in a vehicle at the BP Service Station at [REDACTED]. Investigators observed this vehicle, a [REDACTED] four-wheel drive, registration [REDACTED] parked at the service station. During the course of surveillance investigators observed [REDACTED] at the service station removing containers from the rear of that vehicle, before returning them to the vehicle. During surveillance [REDACTED] was observed to collect the vehicle and meet and perform anti-surveillance techniques in the immediate vicinity of the service station. They observed [REDACTED] and another person [REDACTED] (hereinafter referred to as [REDACTED]) meet in an alleyway, where it is believed the [REDACTED] the [REDACTED] were passed to [REDACTED] was intercepted by uniform members and the [REDACTED] was arrested and the exhibits processed by detectives attached the [REDACTED] from VPFSC attended and initial analysis of the [REDACTED] shows that it is approximately [REDACTED] (hereinafter referred to as [REDACTED]).

47. On [REDACTED] 2006 investigators met with [REDACTED] at his request, and he stated that he wanted to clear the air and confirm he was not being investigated. The meeting was monitored by surveillance operatives and recorded.

48. On 13 April 2006 the RHS stated that [REDACTED] had packed up the [REDACTED] from the [REDACTED] location and [REDACTED] it to [REDACTED] of the [REDACTED] address. The RHS also stated that [REDACTED] would be attending at the [REDACTED] to collect a [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] from [REDACTED].

49. On 14 April 2006 RHS stated that the new location of [REDACTED] was in the [REDACTED] area, in close proximity to a [REDACTED] in a vacant [REDACTED] that was being renovated and that [REDACTED] was in the process of [REDACTED] a [REDACTED] the [REDACTED]. The RHS also stated that [REDACTED] had paid [REDACTED] to rent the premises for [REDACTED].

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50. Surveillance conducted in the [REDACTED] area on [REDACTED] 2006 identified the address of [REDACTED] as fitting the above description. Whilst conducting surveillance investigators could hear the sound of a loud noise, similar to the sound of a hammer drill emanating from the premises. Investigators also observed lights to be on in the premises. At this time investigators observed vehicle [REDACTED] parked in the rear yard of the premises.

51. On [REDACTED] 2006 surveillance conducted on the rear of [REDACTED] observed vehicle [REDACTED] to reverse into the back yard of the premises and [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] exit. Both were then observed to unload numerous items including [REDACTED] from the rear of the vehicle into the premises. Both were then observed to exit then re-enter the premises on a number of occasions. [REDACTED] was observed to use a [REDACTED] or similar to [REDACTED] through the [REDACTED] of the building.

52. On [REDACTED] 2006 surveillance conducted in the vicinity of [REDACTED] observed [REDACTED] and other unknown males arriving at and entering the premises. All remained at the premises for approximately 4 hours before leaving.

53. Later on [REDACTED] 2006 surveillance conducted in the vicinity of [REDACTED] observed [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] attend at the premises. Both spent in excess of 9 hours at the premises constructing an enclosed area around the rear door.

54. On [REDACTED] 2006 surveillance conducted in the vicinity of [REDACTED] observed [REDACTED] and an unknown male attend at the address. Upon [REDACTED] later attending at the premises a trailer was observed to be reversed up to the [REDACTED] and a [REDACTED] to prevent the contents of the trailer being observed. The contents of the trailer were then unloaded into the premises.

#### Current Situation and Proposed Execution

55. At [REDACTED] hours on [REDACTED] 2006 [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were [REDACTED] the [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] by members attached to the Special Operations Group (SOG). A warrant was executed at the address and a [REDACTED] located. [REDACTED] were arrested and interviewed at St Kilda Road Police Complex.

56. As a result of this arrest investigators have been in received further information in regards to the involvement of [REDACTED] in the [REDACTED] Further evidence has been obtained through the use of physical surveillance, listening devices and optical surveillance devices in respect to the involvement of [REDACTED] and associates in the [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] throughout Victoria.



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57. On [REDACTED] 2006 [REDACTED] contacted [REDACTED] and arranged a meeting. [REDACTED] subsequently met with [REDACTED] at which time [REDACTED] agreed to press [REDACTED] worth of [REDACTED] into [REDACTED] stated he would do this for [REDACTED]. He further stated that he did not want to complete the [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] stating that he wanted the [REDACTED] all at once.

58. The execution of phase four (4) of the investigation is proposed to take place at approximately 8.00 pm tonight with a meeting between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] situated at [REDACTED] [REDACTED] will then attend at [REDACTED] home address at [REDACTED] [REDACTED] will inform [REDACTED] that he has [REDACTED] and a [REDACTED]. It is envisaged that a discussion will take place between the two (2) in regards to the price to be paid for the [REDACTED] around [REDACTED] [REDACTED] will insist [REDACTED] provide him with [REDACTED] of the money before the [REDACTED] area handed over. [REDACTED] will obtain the money from [REDACTED] who has already indicated that he has access to such an amount of money and request that [REDACTED] provide him with [REDACTED] to use in a subsequent [REDACTED].

59. [REDACTED] for [REDACTED] is being provided by [REDACTED] and monitoring of the meeting is taking place through the use of listening devices.

60. Surveillance of the property is being undertaken by the State Surveillance Unit.

61. The proposed course of action is to allow the exchange of money from [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] the collection of the [REDACTED] by [REDACTED] and for [REDACTED] to clear the address.

62. A tactical assessment will then be undertaken by the Forward Commander, with the entry and arrest of [REDACTED] to be executed by the SOG at the home address.

63. A simultaneous search warrant will also be executed at [REDACTED] with [REDACTED] and other persons identified as offending against the [REDACTED] Act arrested at the discretion of the relevant Forward Commander.

64. It is anticipated that offenders will be charged with [REDACTED] in a [REDACTED] as a result of listening device and telephone intercept material obtained during the investigation phase.

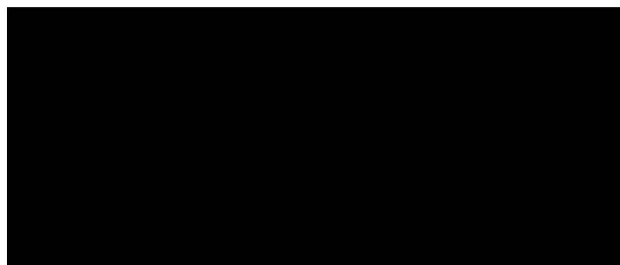
### Arrests

All arrests made will be at the discretion of the Forward Commander.

All offenders are to be conveyed to the MDID offices located on the 12<sup>th</sup> floor of 412 St. Kilda Road, Melbourne for processing. The goods lift should be utilised to transfer suspects from the ground floor to the MDID offices.

### Search Warrant

The following Search warrants have been issued:-



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After the arrest of the targets nominated members will regroup at the Purana Taskforce and arrangements made for the execution of further search warrants, as deemed appropriate by the investigation leader.

Appropriate Task Force personnel will be directed to prepare affidavits and obtain any further Search Warrants deemed necessary.

If any search warrant is executed and no person is found present, the Command Post is to be advised. The local Divisional Supervisor and Forward Commander will be notified to attend.

The Command Post will inform the On-Line Supervisor and relevant Divisional Supervisor of the intention to execute any search warrants.

### **Damage**

The Command Post must be immediately notified of any damage caused in the execution of any search warrant and will arrange for the attendance of the local Divisional Supervisor as per the Operating Procedures Manual.

### **Support Services**

Any request for support services are to be made through the Command Post.

### **Searches**

Searches of persons, vehicles and premises should be carried out in a thorough and methodical manner.

All searches should be conducted in the presence of the offender to afford the best possible evidentiary value regarding any exhibits found and to reduce the potential of complaints against members.

Consideration should be given to fingerprint and DNA evidence when conducting searches and due care should be given to the handling of exhibits in this regard. All mobile telephones and associated paperwork are to be seized.

### **Exhibits and Property**

It is the responsibility of team leaders to nominate the Exhibits Officer who must record all exhibits in an exhibit log. The Exhibits Officer is responsible for continuity of the exhibits until details are entered into the PB and the exhibits are lodged at EMU or otherwise secured.

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It is the team leader's responsibility to check and ensure accuracy of the exhibit log prior to leaving the scene. It is also desirable that any relevant offender be afforded the opportunity to sign the exhibit log at the completion of the search.

All exhibits are to be photographed in-situ prior to being collected and labelled. The team leader is responsible for nominating a member to take photographs and maintain a photographic log.

### **Cash Seizures**

If cash monies of \$1,000 or more are located during any search, the Command Post is to be notified immediately. An officer will be required to attend and count such money as per Crime Department Instructions.

### **Brief Coordinator**

Detective Senior Constable Paul ROWE is the brief co-ordinator for this Operation.

### **Casualties**

Injuries to any persons throughout the course of the Operation are to be brought to the immediate attention of the Command Post.

Any request for an ambulance is to be made via Intergraph. The following channels apply:

### **Operational Safety Principles**

All members involved in this Operation are to be OSTT qualified and must carry their appropriate departmental firearm. All members issued with firearms must also carry an ASP baton and O/C spray.

Members must carry and use firearms in accordance with the current OSTT instructions. The operational safety principles are to be strictly adhered to and are of paramount importance.

In the event of a firearms incident, the Operations Commander must be immediately notified and members are to secure the crime scene pending his arrival. Any injured person is to be conveyed to hospital via ambulance immediately. The Forward Commander will take responsibility for the initial control of the scene.

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### **Declaration of Informers, Covert Operatives, Telephone Intercepts, or Surveillance Devices/Techniques**

At no time is any member permitted to divulge any information relating to the involvement of informers, police covert operatives, telephone intercepts, or surveillance devices/techniques without the express permission of the Investigation Leader, Detective Acting Senior Sergeant FLYNN.

### **Situation Reports**

The Command Post is to be updated of all relevant events immediately.

### **Pursuits**

No pursuits are to be initiated during this Operation other than at the direction of the Forward Commander. He will assume the initial role of pursuit controller until such time as an arrest is made or an open police channel is notified and a local supervisor assumes that role.

### **Media**

The Operations Commander in consultation with the Forward Commander will be responsible for the coordination of any media releases in relation to the Operation.
