

You - - -

MS GOBBO: I was a - - -

Yeah.

MS GOBBO: - - - very compliant individual. I have a track record of being compliant, it didn't get me anywhere. It hasn't led to me being safe. But it's - so assume for the sake of the argument I can be compliant.

Yep.

Well, I couldn't, you know.

MS GOBBO: Then are you in a position to guarantee?

It's the accidental meeting, that's always a problem, but I would be able to minimise - certainly be able to say to you we could mitigate risk to you. But to - to give you one hundred per cent, I couldn't give that to anyone and I wouldn't, partly because, as I say, you - you can be relocated to and and still bump into someone

MS GOBBO: So when you do a ---

MS GOBBO: When you do a - whatever it's called - - -

MS GOBBO: Yeah. Where a person should go or - - -

Yeah.

MS GOBBO: - - - could go. How - I mean, without you telling me - 'cause I think you told me you can't tell me - what do you - what do you look at?

Mm.

MS GOBBO: First committal is October, there's another one in November and another one in March next year.

Mm.

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MS GOBBO: Nuh, no. It's a double-edged sword. Do I really want to even speak to any of these people? But if I don't speak to them it looks like I'm hiding something and I'd rather speak to them and confront my enemies or potential enemies so I hear what's going on, not know - 'cause I've got no-one else telling me.
