I am [redacted] years.

I make this statement of my own free will.

On Tuesday 25 April 2006 [redacted] [redacted] police were monitoring my movements and recording my conversation at the time.

At about 6.20 pm I attended at [redacted] Brunswick. I was in possession of a box wrapped in silver paper with a blue ribbon. Within that box was 5 bags of white powder [redacted] amphetamine. Each bag weighed 450 grams. I had previously arranged to sell these bags to Milad for \$37,500.00 each. [redacted]

I drove a vehicle into the driveway of [redacted] Brunswick. Milad Mokbel was at the front door with the remote and opened the gate.

I went up to Milad then whispered to me as follows;

- He said that a lab had gone off in Strathmore and that two guys had been arrested a couple of days ago. He said that the Police were still watching it. I told Milad that I knew nothing about it.
- Milad said that he knew it was not me, and I said that I knew nothing about it.

I then started to throw off and I asked Milad how much ketone did they grab? By that I was talking about [redacted] litres of ketone that had been seized from Tony Bayeh and another person I know as [redacted]. This had happened about a week ago.

Milad said, [redacted] litres.

I said, fuck that would have been fantastic to flip that. By that I mean convert it to amphetamine

We walked through the front door and to the laundry area. It is located down the hallway, to the third room to the left. I carried the box of [redacted] amphetamine into the laundry. I placed that box on the laundry table. Also on the laundry table there were several small bags of white powder that I recognized to be a cutting agent in preparation for the package. I could also see cutters and scales. On the other side I saw a plastic bag wrapped tightly which looked like a brick. I assumed it to be the money. Mr Cooper

I said, "Here's the box. Have you got the money?" Graham Evans-O

Milad said, "is there 5 there?"

I said, "of course."

He handed me the money.

Milad ripped the paper and smelt the opening of the box. PII
he said, "beautiful".

I said, "how much is there?"

He said, "\$87,000.00".

I said, "what happened to the \$95,000.00."

He said, "thank your lover girl, she has taken it shopping. (By that he meant that his wife Renee had gone shopping)."

I said OK, "no problem. I have got to get going and drop the other box to Horthy (Mokbel). We will catch up soon."

He looked surprised that I wasn't making all the transactions with him and that I had allocated product to his other brother.

Milad escorted me back to the car and I placed the money in the front seat. A short time later the S.O.G. entered the premises and we were both arrested.

I was then taken to the St Kilda Road Police Complex by ^{Graham Evans-O} and made this statement.
